# How to prepare a Ward Profile

Every five years your WDC will need to produce a Ward Priorities Plan.

In some LLGs you will also need to prepare a Ward Profile. The Ward Profile is a document which records important information about your Ward – like the number of people living in each village or the number of girls in grade 4 or the number of vehicles that are working.

Eventually WDCs won't need to complete the Ward Profile. The LLG will get this information from the Village Record Book instead – and it will be the responsibility of the Ward Recorder (Ward Development Officer) to fill out the Village Record Book and keep it up-to-date.

However, until this happens WDCs will need to prepare a Ward Profile. Prepare your Ward Profile when you prepare your Ward Priorities Plan.



### Small groups (40 minutes)

Get into your WDC groups. Have a look at the Ward Profile form (at the end of this Handbook). This is the same Ward Profile

form that you will need to complete and update each year. Ask the Trainer if there is anything that is unclear Make sure everyone realises that the Ward Profile form at the end of the Handbook is a real form. If necessary, the WDC can use this form to do their Ward Profile.

Go through the Ward Profile form and answer the questions below. Be prepared to share your answers:

- 1. Are the instructions easy to follow?
- 2. What parts are you unclear about?
- 3. Why is it a good idea to USE PENCIL when you fill it out?
- 4. What should you do if you cannot fit all the information you want to include in the space provided?
- 5. When do you need to submit your Ward Profile to the LLG?

When you have developed your Ward Profile you need to show it to the key people in your Ward before you submit it to the LLG. *Askim ol long konfirmim na oraitim.* The Ward Profile belongs to the people of the Ward not the WDC.

### **General discussion (2 minutes)**

Why do you need to show the Ward Profile to key people in your Ward?

You need to submit your Ward Profile (and your Ward Priorities Plan) to the LLG in July. When you submit your Ward Priorities Plan to the LLG make three copies:

- ✓ One copy for the LLG to keep ol bai nidim
- ✓ One copy for the WDC to put in their filing cabinet rekod bilong Wod
- ✓ One copy for the WDC to put on a Ward notice board for everyone to see



Keep the original Ward Priorities Plan so that next year you can use it as the form that you update – but only if you USE PENCIL. *Em nau tok strong nau* always USE PENCIL to complete your Ward Priorities Plan. If you do this, then you will only need the one Ward Priorities Plan form – although it is a good idea to start again with brand new form every five years *nogut pepa bruk*.



Don't forget to put the copy of the Ward Profile on a Ward notice board for everyone to see. Everyone in the Ward should feel like they have their hands on the steering wheel.



# **How to update your Ward Profile**

Now you know how to prepare a Ward Profile.

Tasol yu laik plenim nau olgeta yia yu mas prunim gut. The Ward Profile needs to be pruned each and every year.

This means each and every year the WDC needs to go through the Ward Profile and make sure the information is up-to-date.



If you need to prepare a Ward Profile, then the target for your WDC should be to have the Ward Profile updated *na redi i stap* by the end of February each and every year. The reason you need to wait until the end of February is that some information for the Ward Profile, like information on school enrolment, can only be completed after the school year begins in the middle of February.

#### **General discussion (2 minutes)**

When should you have your Ward Profile updated by each year?

To update your Ward Profile it is simply a matter of going through the form at the start of each year and changing what you need to so that the information is correct. If you USE PENCIL when you complete your Ward Profile this is easy.

You will definitely need to get help to update some sections of the Ward Profile – for example the section on Education will need help from the Head Teacher and the section on Health will need help from a Health Worker. When you have developed your Ward Profile you need to show it to the key people in your Ward before you submit it to the LLG. Askim ol long konfirmim na oraitim. Yu save! The LLG needs your Ward Profile to help them develo their LLG Development plan. The LLG needs your updated Ward Profile each year so they can update their LLG Development plan each year. If you rely on information in last year's Ward Profile, it might be out of date. ✓ Updating your Ward Profile means that if you want help from a donor or another organisation you have up-to-date information to give them. ✓ Updating your Ward Profile every year means you will build up a record (a data-base) of what is happening in your Ward. General discussion (2 minutes) Why is it a good idea to keep a record of your old Ward Profiles? PNG is an oral culture. History, tumbuna stories, who is related to who, rules and

kastom, what decision the Chief made – everything is passed on by word of

mouth and remembered.

PNG is changing. Now PNG is becoming an oral and print culture. In an oral and print culture things are remembered *and* written down.

What a story it would show if your Ward had a copy of the Ward Profile for each year going back 30 years. This is written history.

### Pairs (15 minutes)

### **General discussion (2 minutes)**

Who is responsible for updating the Ward Profile?

The Ward Recorder is responsible for updating the Ward Profile – and for submitting it to the LLG. This doesn't mean the Ward Recorder does everything – but they are responsible for making sure it is done.

It is far better if the whole WDC is involved with updating the Ward Profile. Most WDCs hold a ward planning meeting to do this. *Wod em i gaden bilong yupela olgeta na moa beta yupela olgeta wokbung long prunim na lukautim.* 

### Revision - ask the participants the key questions for this topic:

- 1) When should you prepare a new Ward Profile?
- 2) When should you update your Ward Profile?



Your LLG should give you a new Ward Profile form when it is time to develop a new Ward Priorities Plan (every five years). It is a good idea to USE PENCIL to complete the form. When you submit your Ward Profile (and Ward Priorities Plan) to the LLG in July make three copies - one for the LLG, one for you to put in your Ward filing cabinet, and one to put on a Ward notice board for everyone to see. Keep the original form each year as the one you update. Because you used pencil just rub out and change what you need to. If your LLG asks you to submit the Ward Profile that you update each year then do so. Repeat the same process – make three copies but keep the original form to update each year. Province.....
